DuPage Foundation COVID-19 Response Fund Launched with More Than \$600,000 to Aid DuPage Not-for-Profits During Crisis

Media Fact Sheet

- <u>The DuPage Foundation</u>, a 501(c)(3) public charity, focused on serving the residents of DuPage County, IL, has launched the <u>COVID-19 Response Fund</u>.
- Created on March 19, the Fund has already secured more than \$600,000 thanks to the support of generous lead partners including the Birck Family of Hinsdale and Naperville, the <u>Illinois COVID-19 Response Fund</u>, two area private foundations wishing to remain anonymous, and grants from the Gustafson Family Foundation and Snodgrass Family Funds of the DuPage Foundation, along with scores of contributions from other individuals, businesses, and foundations.
- The DuPage Foundation's COVID-19 Response Fund focuses exclusively on supporting DuPage County not-for-profits that are on the front line in providing critical aid to local residents who have been most affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Grants from the Fund will be awarded on a rolling basis, based on availability of resources, to DuPage County 501(c)(3) organizations, as needs are identified. The Fund will remain flexible to ensure that it supports current priorities as well as those that emerge as more hardships become evident.
- Initial grant priorities for the Fund include:
 - Emergency food and basic needs
 - o Interim shelter and housing
 - Primary health and mental health services
 - Utility and financial assistance
 - Not-for-profit organizations' safety and technology needs to serve clients while sheltering in place
- To apply for funding, DuPage not-for-profits should visit <u>dupagefoundation.org</u> and complete the <u>short application</u>.
- The Foundation plans to award its first grants from the Fund on Wed., April 15.
- The Foundation has also created a <u>resource portal</u> with information and links for donors, not-for-profits, professional advisors, businesses, and others about opportunities for aid and charitable incentives available under the new <u>Coronavirus</u> Aid, Relief, and.
